Background

The Scottish Seabird Centre is a conservation and education charity whose purpose is "Inspiring and educating people about the Scottish marine environment, motivating them to care for it, and supporting conservation".

Scotland is famous for its globally important seabird populations. But they are under threat. Populations have plummeted, and urgent action is needed to save our seabirds. The Scottish Seabird Centre delivers vital conservation action — and what we do works. Our Puffin SOS project has quadrupled the number of puffins on Craigleith in the Firth of Forth, and we also manage other islands for seabirds in the area, including Bass Rock.

Based in North Berwick, East Lothian we overlook the beautiful and internationally important Firth of Forth. We are a gateway to nature, introducing over 175,000 people every year to Scotland's special marine environment and inspiring a love of nature. We also take this message to schools, engaging and inspiring thousands of children every year to love nature.

We have four key pillars to our work:

- **Conservation** we develop, undertake, and promote models of conservation best practice and citizen science. We manage seabird islands
- **Education** we deliver education programmes, science resources and events and use innovative ways to provide information on the marine environment.
- **Communities** we work in partnership with diverse communities including enhancing the experience for visitors to North Berwick.
- **Experience** we offer a year-round visitor experience that helps people to make informed choices about the management of the marine environment.

As a face-to-face fundraiser for the Scottish Seabird Centre, you will play a critical role as an ambassador for the charity, engaging visitors to the Centre and inspiring them to join as a member, raising vital funds for our charitable work.

Principal duties
