Traffic collision or related injury	1	5	Participants given a verbal warning before crossing/walking on the road.	
Drowning/strong tides	1	5	Participants given a verbal warning not to enter the sea. Group to be kept away from water above welly height. Tide tides to be checked before event.

Falling from heights	1	5	Participants must stay back from steep drops at all times. Safety briefing given before work begins.	Only possible at 1 location during the walk
